05/03/1940 Sgt Barker and P/O Posselt 3rd section of 2 a/c led by Sgt. Barker with P/O Posselt took off to attack troops ? Between Sallie and Bapaume or alternative target given by recco aircraft. Attack was sucessfully made at 15:05 in village of Bealuncourt Section landed at 16:00 hours, No targets received from Belheim a/c.

11/05/1940 all 06:10 Attack on aerodrome by 18 to 24 enemy aircraft from 12 to 15,000ft. About 150 bombs estimated 100lbs were dropped to SW and SE of aerodrome. Part of the wood, armory tent and ? Set on fire and destroyed. Battle P2334 set on fire and completely destroyed when 2, 250lb GP bombs carried on aircraft exploded. Night flying floodlight rendered u/s from bomb ? and one aircraft P2335 rendered temporally u/s. 18 bomb craters on aerodrome and 5 unexploded bombs found on N edge of aerodrome (s)
