Set on fire and destroyed. Battle P2334 set on fire and completely destroyed when 2, 250lb GP bombs carried on aircraft exploded. Night flying floodlight rendered u/s from bomb ? and one aircraft P2335 rendered temporarily u/s. 18 bomb craters on aerodrome and 5 unexploded bombs found on N edge of aerodrome (s)
14/05/1940 K9483	P/O Posselt Sgt. Bowen AC Vano	15:24	These 4 Aircraft left base to bomb pontoon bridges over the Meuse All aircraft and crews are missing

Leaving base at 15:18 and 15:24 hours four aircraft in two sorties of two left to bomb pontoon bridges over the river at SEDAN as a result of this operation the following aircraft and crews are missing
